BALANCING INCENTIVE PROGRAM DLA-20 TRAINING AND IMPLEMENTATION UPDATE

JANUARY 5, 2017

Applicable to Adult Mental Health Providers that are approved or licensed as Assertive Community Treatment (ACT) Programs, Mobile Treatment Services (MTS) Programs, Psychiatric Rehabilitation Programs (PRPs), and/or Residential Rehabilitation Programs (RRPs)

The DLA-20 will be implemented effective, February 1, 2017.

To prepare providers for the integration of the DLA-20 within the Beacon Health Options system, the following training sessions will be provided:

- January 18, 2017 from 10-11:30 AM [Register](#)

It is only necessary to attend one such training as each session covers exactly the same content.

This training is designed to orient relevant provider staff to the unique features of the DLA-20 workflow and to demonstrate how to navigate the ProviderConnect system to enter DLA-20 data and related information within the context of the service authorization request. Both staff that administer the DLA-20 and those that submit authorizations within the Beacon Health Options system should attend this training.



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Please be advised that this training does not replace the half-day training that is required for provider staff to be authorized by the purveyors of the instrument to administer the DLA-20.

As a reminder, staff or supervisors of staff who currently complete assessments for ACT, MTS, PRP, and RRP assessments are required to be trained in the DLA-20. This training is offered free of charge by BHA through the University of Maryland's Training Center and Evidence-Based Practice Center, with CEUs and Certificates of Attendance being offered upon completion of the training.
