Specialty Residential Substance Use Disorder (SUD) Services for Adults

Provider Interest Meeting

OCTOBER 13, 2017

Please join the Department for a provider interest meeting about the transition of Specialty Residential SUD Services for Adults to a Medicaid Provider Type 54. Agenda items will include the Medicaid application and enrollment process, staffing requirements, the Behavioral Health Administration (BHA's) application to become an approved specialty provider and requirements, and an overview of upcoming BHA and Beacon trainings. *This informational meeting will be most beneficial for programs/ facilities that already offer specialty residential treatment service to ensure they are ready to transition to fee for service on January 1, 2018.*

Specialty residential services include:

- Health General 8-507;
- Pregnant Women and Women with Children;
- Legislatively mandated initiatives, including SB 512 (1997) Drug Exposed Newborns and HB 7 (2000) Child Welfare Involved Families.

Separate trainings will be available specific to authorizations and billing through Beacon Health Options. Further details forthcoming.
