ASO (Optum Maryland)

Providers are strongly encouraged to work with their reconciliation managers on outstanding negative balances. Providers can access monthly claims history reports-for all claims processed by Optum on request to maryland.provpymt@optum.com or their reconciliation managers. Recoupment for state negative balance amounts will begin on May 20, 2022 for all providers.

Bed Registry Update

- A comprehensive Behavioral Health Provider Directory was launched through 211 Press 1 https://pressone.211md.org/ in March that provides the general public access to search Mental Health and Substance Use Disorder providers by service type, geographic location, and other filter options.
- O An outpatient care coordination pilot is in development to begin before July 1, 2022. The solution involves a dedicated hotline for hospitals to register patients in overstay status coupled with MDH/BHA staff to solve complex cases.

- o <u>COVID-19 Therapeutics Weekly Update 3/25/2022</u>
- O Maryland Department of Health (MDH) Project Firstline aims to stop the spread of infectious disease threats—including COVID-19—by offering free learning opportunities to frontline workers in the healthcare and environmental services fields. Created by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), Project Firstline's materials provide foundational knowledge of infection control so that your staff can implement preventive protocols and procedures throughout their workday.
- O A Physician Support Packet for COVID-19 is found at the Medicaid COVID-19 Provider Update page. It was developed by the Maryland Department of Health, in collaboration with the State's nine Medicaid managed care organizations. It is a compilation of information and resources to support practices in caring for patients in today's COVID-centric environment. The packet also provides clinicians with the opportunity to earn up to 3.5 free Continuing Medical Education (CME) credits. The CME opportunities have different 2022 submission deadlines, 5/15, and 8/15.

Peer Recovery Specialists

- OTPs (COVID19 and ARPA FBG Supplements) Funding allocated to 6 jurisdictions across Maryland (BHSB, Frederick, Harford, Howard, Washington, and Worcester) to expand the availability of peers for individuals utilizing OTP settings. To date Harford Co is the first to hire Peers with the other jurisdictions in various stages of recruiting individuals to available positions.
- Crisis Centers (ARPA FBG Supplement) Funding allocated to 5 jurisdictions (Frederick, Harford, Howard, St. Mary's, and Worcester) to expand the availability of peers for individuals experiencing crisis and utilizing walk-in services. To date 3 of the 5 jurisdictions have received award letters with the final two programs anticipating announcements in the near future.
- Certification Fund (SOR and ARPA FBG Supplement) This funding partnership between MABPCB and BHA is covering the cost for individuals seeking the CPRS credential in Maryland. To date BHA has funded more than 119 individuals to obtain their initial or recertification as a CPRS in Maryland.



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Suicide Prevention

- Dionne Bowie is the new Director of the Office of Suicide Prevention. She will be responsible for the overall management and functioning of the statewide Suicide Prevention initiatives.
- The Maryland State Department of Education (MSDE) is partnering with the Office of Suicide Prevention to assist in providing materials, training, resources, and support for the Maryland School Mental Health Program, serving the 24 local school systems in Maryland.
- Projects for Assistance in Transition from Homelessness (PATH)The Behavioral Health
 Administration is in the process of completing the 2022 PATH Application due to SAMHSA on April
 25, 2022. The application will renew more than \$1M for homeless services to individuals
 experiencing homelessness.
 - Continuum of Care (CoC): The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) announced on March 14, 2022 their award for FY 2021 CoC Competition Awards.
